Celebration of Yukon Francophonie Day

Whitehorse, May 10, 2024 – The Yukon community is warmly invited to come together to celebrate Yukon Francophonie Day (JFY), which will take place on Wednesday, May 15, from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m. at Mount McIntyre Recreation Centre. The event will feature live musical performances by the William Pacaud Band and the Pink House Band, savory and sweet snacks to enjoy, children's entertainment including a bouncy castle and face painting, and the presentation of the 2024 Exceptional Engagement Award. This bilingual event is free and open to the entire community.

"We are delighted to bring the community together for this special occasion," expressed Lorraine Taillefer, President of the Association franco-yukonnaise (AFY). "Yukon Francophonie Day is a privileged moment to celebrate our culture and language," she added.
